

Being an Animal Scientist

Term 4 is just around the corner, and we are excited to introduce our new inquiry theme. The big idea guiding our learning is that "Scientists observe, wonder and investigate the living world to understand how animals survive and thrive".

Our students will be exploring three main lines of inquiry throughout the term:


Classification: How do scientists classify animals?

Habitats and Adaptation: How do animals survive and thrive?

Te Taiao and Me: Protecting the animals around us

This inquiry also links to our **He Manu Rere** learner profile, focusing on Ako (teaching and learning from each other), being a Collaborative and Critical Thinker, and being Curious and Creative. Students will learn to use their imagination, ask questions, and solve problems as they investigate the animal world. Students will delve into key concepts such as classifying animals into groups like mammals, reptiles, and birds, and understanding how animals have adapted to their environments. They will also explore the needs of animals to survive and thrive, and learn about the threats animals face, both in Aotearoa and globally.

We are all looking forward to our zoo trips, which will serve as a provocation for our inquiry. A reminder that the Kauri classes will go on **Wednesday**, **October 8**, and the **Rimu classes will go on Thursday**, **October 9**. Thank you to everyone who volunteered to help; your child's teacher will be in touch soon with more details.




