Fine to Climb

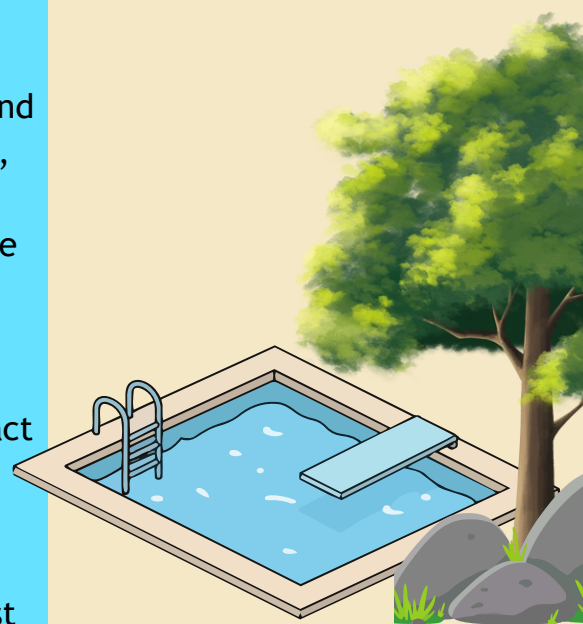
Visitors to the school may have noticed these signs around the grounds. Following a safety review of our trees, we have made it clear to the children which trees they are allowed to climb - no sign, no climb! There is also some advice about how to safely climb trees and the teachers will be talking to the children about this information as well.

Use of the School Pool

We feel that it is essential for all children living in New Zealand to be confident and competent around water. Because of this, Aquatic Education will take place in all classrooms this term. All classes will be taking part in lessons in class that helps give children the knowledge that will help keep them safe.

The Year 3-6 children will begin their in-pool lessons soon. If you have not filled in a permission form for this, please contact the office or your class teacher.

A reminder that the school pool is open for use by the community for the next three Saturday afternoons - 14th, 21st and 28th February. There is no cost for swimmers and parents and siblings are very welcome to join the children in the pool.



Parent Use of the Donovan Street Carpark



Golden Apple have confirmed that they intend to open around August this year and that the Blockhouse Bay community will be very welcome to use the carpark when this happens.

They have also said that our school parents can use the carpark before then on week days. **However**, there are a number of issues around this that would need to be addressed before this would be the case.

1. The carpark would not be open in the mornings
2. To prevent vandalism, the carpark would need to be opened at 2.30pm and closed at 3.30pm each day
3. The school does not have a spare staff member to do this as we have other responsibilities at this time.

Therefore, if we are going to open the Donovan Street carpark for after school pick ups, we would need to have a commitment from one or more parents to:

- Open the carpark gate at 2.30pm and remain at the entrance until 3.30pm. (your child would need to meet you there)
- Remind every parent that comes in, of the need to leave the carpark by 3.30pm (we would provide signage to help with this)
- Let other members of the public know that they could not park in there- School Parking Only

We are now looking to see if we can get enough people who would commit to doing this job. If you are interested, please email office@blockhousebay.school.nz and tell us which days you would be interested in taking on this role. If we do have enough volunteers, we will open the carpark after school each day.

Attendance



Our aim is for children to come to school 90% of the time. That is up to 4 absences in term one.

Our school goal is to have 75% of our students attending regularly (90% or more). There are strong links with a student's performance at school and their attendance.

The Ministry of Education have asked us to let everyone know that holidays during time time are classified as unjustified absences.
