STAFFING UPDATE:

This week, we welcomed Linda Dai and Shelley Butt to our teaching team. Miss Dai will be teaching in Weka A in the Kōwhai team and Shelley Sensei is teaching in Kōkōriki B as part of the Kōwhai team. We also have three staff members who won new roles at the end of 2023 and have taken on new responsibilities at the start of this year:

THE SCHOOL DAY

The instructional school day goes from 8.50am - 3.00pm The children should arrive at school <u>no later than 8.30am</u> so that they can be ready for the start of the first lesson.

We ask that no child should arrive at school before 8.15am. Staff members are busy preparing for the day and cannot supervise children before this time and so any children (and adults) arriving before this time, must assemble by the Pohutukawa's in front of Te Whau until this time. Whilst we realise that this does not suit all parents, we feel that the children's safety and teacher preparation time is very important.

Please contact the school office for details about our Before School Care programme if you wish to have your child at school before 8.15am.

Attendance and Punctuality

As previously mentioned, the Ministry of Education has mandated that schools do more to make sure that children are at school and on time unless they are sick. The have pointed out that missing just one day a fortnight of school means missing a whole year of learning by the time a child turns 16. It is for this reason that they say that taking a child out of school for a holiday is marked as being an Unjustified Absence. We totally support families ensuring that their children experience being part of their culture but encourage parents to be mindful of the effects on school learning when this happens a lot.

We also want parents to continue to keep their children home if they are sick or displaying symptoms of Covid.
