Tēnā koutou e te whānau,

While there are only two weeks to go until the end of the 2025 school year, there are certainly a number of fun and exciting activities taking place. We had a great turn out at the Rimu Whānau celebration and everyone enjoyed taking part in all of the activities together. Whānau are also tuning out in large numbers for our team assemblies and it is great to see the children developing their audience and performance skills at these events.

The teachers are currently working hard to consolidate all of the assessment data and write the end of year comments for the children's term four reports. Under the new Curriculum documents, some children's achievement levels will appear to be lower than previously, so it is important that families are aware of this in advance. For example, things that used to be expected of from Year 5 children are now listed as Year 4 goals so it will seem a child is learning at a lower level. We ask that all families bear this in mind when the end of year reports are published on Monday 15<sup>th</sup> December. You can find more details about this on Hero.

# Farewell to Staff Members

We would like to say thank you and farewell to two of our Part-time Teachers, Amelia Slade and Lagi Jenkins as well as Annette Bradley, our Deputy Principal and Special Education Needs Coordinator.

## Annette Bradley

Annette leaves us at the end of this term to take up a position at Oaklynn Special School as a classroom teacher, a position she describes as her dream job.

Annette has been a member of the Blockhouse Bay Primary School Community for 13 years firstly as a parent, FAB member and Speld Tutor and then a member of staff. Annette's contribution to the school as a parent has been immense. A key member and chairperson of the school's FAB group, Annette helped raise tens of thousands of dollars for the children. Facilities such as the Fale outdoor space, heating for the pool and shade sails are examples of facilities children still enjoy today as a result of the work that she and her team did on our behalf.

# Property Work in 2026

We have been advised by the Ministry of Education that work is very likely to begin during the school holidays on retaining the subsidence that has taken place along the Gittos Domain side of the school next to the field and down towards the Te Taiao classrooms. Whilst the classes themselves are safe, the area behind the temporary fencing needs quite a lot of work and we expect this project to take about 6 months to complete.

Te Taiao 1 & 2 classrooms will not be occupied during construction and access for the construction team will be via the staff carpark. Unfortunately The Glade will also be used by the construction team so the children will not be able to use this area until at least term three. We are lucky we have so many other spaces for our children to play.

If an action plan from the doctor is required for Asthma, please have this updated and bring to school with new medication.

Any expired medications still held at school after 2.00pm on the 18th December will be thrown away.

# Measles, Mumps and Rubella Advice for Blockhouse Bay School

**The Ministry of Health has provided our school community with the following information and asked us to share it with you.**

Parents are advised to check to see if their child has been vaccinated and take steps to have this done if they have not already done so.

## **Why do I need to have my child vaccinated?**

Measles cases have recently been identified across New Zealand and have already impacted two schools in our region. Measles spreads easily and can be serious for both children and adults.

**According to Ministry of Health records, 20% of Blockhouse Bay School students have not been immunised for Measles, Mumps and Rubella (MMR), mostly because they were not in New Zealand when they were younger.**

Individuals who are not considered immune to measles may need to stay home from school each time they are exposed, to prevent further spread.

MMR vaccination is free in New Zealand for:

- anyone aged under 18, and
- adults eligible for publicly funded healthcare.

It is safe to receive additional doses if someone is unsure of their vaccination history.

Immunisation appointments can be booked:

- at participating pharmacies listed on [Healthpoint](#).
- online at: [Book a vaccine](#).
- by calling the Vaccine Helpline on: 0800 28 29 26
- at general practice, hauora and Pacific providers

People vaccinated overseas should provide their records to a New Zealand healthcare provider so these can be verified and recorded. This will speed up contact tracing and reduce the time they may need to stay away from school if exposed.

## **Measles immunisation – key information**

- Measles is currently spreading in Aotearoa New Zealand. This is a serious illness that spreads easily and can affect both children and adults.
- Two doses of the MMR vaccine after 12 months of age protects 99% of people from measles.
- The MMR vaccine is free for anyone under 18, and for adults 18+ eligible for free healthcare in New Zealand.
- If you or your child haven't had two measles immunisations, or are unsure, it's recommended you get immunised. It is safe for most people to receive another dose.
- Children with two recorded doses after 12 months of age will not need to stay home if exposed to a measles case.

## Public transport services for 2026

Kia ora,

With the end of the school year approaching, we want to reach out to schools and parents with information about public transport in readiness for 2026.

The beginning of the school year, from the second week of February through until Easter, see a sharp increase in demand on Auckland's roads and public transport as schools and universities commence and people return to work from summer holidays. There will be more people than usual on the roads and using public transport services, especially during peak hours.

Each year, Auckland Transport reviews the performance of the network from February to April of the previous year, including school bus services and other popular services. We have already reached out to schools across Auckland asking for roll changes to plan ahead.

Here are three things parents and students can do to help ease the impact on school journeys during this busy time:

- **Ensure student's HOP cards are topped up.** Children ages 5 to 15 are eligible for a child concession giving them 40% off travel by bus, train or ferry when using their registered AT HOP card. For information on how to set up concessions search 'AT HOP card' online.
- **Encourage students to tag on and off each school bus trip.** It is important that everyone tags onboard so we can get accurate information about how many students are onboard each bus. This information is used to make informed adjustments to school bus timetables and bus sizes.
- **Plan ahead for the busy season.** If school buses are not an option for students, they can use urban bus services. You can use AT Journey Planner to find the service that will work best for them. Please know that public transport services will be busier than usual, so it's important to allow enough time for them to arrive early to get their bus, train or ferry in case there are queues.

## Reduce the risk of Number Plate Theft

NZ Police, assisted by Community Patrols are providing a crime prevention initiative called "Operation Safer Plates"

The purpose of this initiative is to make it harder and less likely for offenders to target your vehicle for the purpose of acquiring your registration plates.

Stolen number plates are currently being used for evading detection when offenders are committing offences, such as:

- Petrol drive offs
- Speeding tickets
- Road user charges
- Robberies and thefts
- Or worse, a more serious crime.

This system is designed to replace existing number plates Screws with inexpensive but effective tamper resistant number plate fixing screws.
