Attendance Matters



We want to help every child come to school every day. Our goal is for children to be at school at least **90%** of the time. This means they can only be away 5 days or less each term.

Message from the Ministry of Education: Consultation open for the draft relationships and sexuality education framework

The draft framework for relationships and sexuality education (RSE) is open for feedback until 9 May. The framework aims to provide consistent, age-appropriate and evidence-informed content from Years 0 to 13. It is not compulsory and does not require changes to planned delivery of health education in 2025, or your approach to community consultation.

We are also interested in feedback from your school communities, and have invited whānau to have their say through social media. You are welcome to share this link with parents and caregivers, so that they can be involved in the process too:

Consultation open for draft relationships and sexuality education framework - Ministry of Education

Feedback will shape the final RSE content in the refreshed health and physical education learning area. This is planned to be gazetted in 2026 and required for use from 2027.
