Principals Soap Box

New, New Curriculum Given to Schools

Late in 2024, NZ primary schools were provided with a new curriculum for English and Mathematics and the expectation was that this would be phased in over the next twelve months. Schools were told that they needed to be teaching from these documents by the start of 2026.

Like most schools, we committed the hours of work that were needed to learn how to implement the new documents and to complete all of the necessary work in the background to link these to our assessment and reporting requirements. We believe that parents need to know where their children are in relation to the curriculum and there is a lot that needs to happen behind the scenes to achieve this.

The Ministry of Education told us that some refining of the new curriculum was possible in term four of this year, but that most of the new announcements at this time would be around adding Years 7-10 to the English and Mathematics documents.

Last Sunday, teachers and leaders across the country were totally blindsided by the issuing of two completely new Curriculums in these subject areas. It was heartbreaking to see that most of the work we (and other schools) had done over the last 12 months was for nothing and that we needed to start all over again. Money spent on training and resourcing have been wasted with no thought given to how these changes will impact children, parents and teachers.

The New Zealand Principals Federation sent out a press release about this, making the following points:

- The scale of change was once again not what schools had been told would happen
- Schools have wasted significant time and resources
- The new implementation timeline is unrealistic and not achievable
- The need to teach exactly the same things to all students does not take into account that children start at different levels and their learning moves at a different pace
- The new assessment tool is not operational and so we have no way of assessing children's starting point or progress
- The government is not consulting with principals or teachers about the new curriculum documents and not surprisingly, what is being asked is not achievable.

They summarised their frustration by saying "Principals are losing trust in the Minister and the system. We were all told to "just get started," only to face radical and unexpected changes at the eleventh hour without explanation or consultation".

As always, teachers and school leaders are very enthusiastic about making learning more effective for our children but the unrealistic expectations of the government and lack of consultation with the sector is quickly eroding trust between us.

Whilst I cannot influence what is happening at the national level, what I can assure you all is that as always, the Blockhouse Bay School staff will continue to work tirelessly to provide the best possible education for the children despite these unreasonable and unhelpful changes.

Part of implementing the curriculum this year has been bringing our pathways into line with the new document. These were scheduled to be shared with you on our website soon and we have decided to continue with this. Next year, we will change these again to align them with the version of the curriculum that has just been given to us.
